Topics covered: The Right To Be In Control, The Right To Have A Sense Of Purpose, The Right To Touch And Be Touched, The Right To Have One's Beliefs And Values Respected, The Right To Hear The Truth, The Right To Be In Denial, The Right To Reminisce and The Right To Laugh.

### OBJECTIVES:

- Discuss ways of adjusting assessments and care plans to meet the needs of the dying.
- Explain tools and techniques designed to increase a patient's sense of control and sense of purpose.
- Use appropriate tools for addressing a client's religious/spiritual concerns.
- Discuss ways of addressing a patient's anger and denial.
